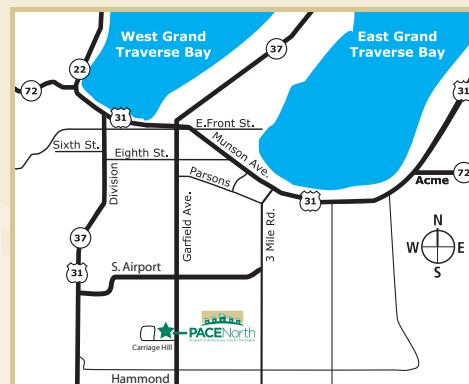

### What is PACE?

PACE (Program of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly) provides coordinated care for nursing-home eligible older adults so that they are supported in living safe and healthy lives in their own homes. PACE is centered on the belief that it is better for the well-being of seniors with chronic care needs and their families to be together – living at home.

PACE North will help allow northern Michigan seniors to remain independent in their own homes and communities.

### Eligibility

In order to join PACE North an individual must:

- Be age 55 or older
- Be certified as meeting the State of Michigan criteria for nursing facility level-of-care
- Live within the PACE North service area
- Be able to live safely in the community with the support of PACE North

### Everyone wants to stay in the comfort of their own home.

The leadership at Grand Traverse Pavilions realizes that no matter how well we care for our residents, they would all prefer to be living at home. It was with that in mind that the Grand Traverse Pavilions Foundation set out to raise funds to bring PACE, the Program of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly, to northern Michigan. PACE North will provide an alternative to nursing home care for participants – allowing aging adults to remain independent in their own homes and communities with support.

The former Grand Traverse County Health Department building is now newly renovated as The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg–PACE Center where participants may receive medical and supportive services. Services may also be provided in the comfort of the participant's home. PACE North has partnered with many specialists and providers in the community to ensure that participants get the care they need.

A participant may be fully liable for the costs of medical services from an out-of-network provider or for services provided without prior authorization (except in emergency services).

PACE North will serve Benzie, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, and Wexford Counties, along with parts of Antrim and Manistee Counties.
